General Policy and Requirements

Purpose

This document describes the:

- requirements to protect against employee exposure to hazards that cause occupational disease and illness
- methods used to carry out these requirements
- hazards that cause occupational disease and illness

Policy

The Company is committed to minimizing the hazards from toxic substances.

Requirements

To reduce employee exposure hazards that cause occupational disease and illness, the Company must:

- monitor contaminant levels in the work environment
- examine all employees at risk
- institute:
 - o engineering controls
 - o administrative measures
- train employees in
 - o proper use of personal protective equipment to prevent contamination
 - o warning signs of contamination
- notify employees who have been overexposed to toxic substances

Examining Facilities

Purpose This document describes the policy for examining facilities.

Policy As part of the Audit Program, examine facilities by:

- reviewing the Safety Data Sheet (SDS) reference file
- monitoring the employee's environment if required

IF employees are exposed to toxic hazards, **THEN** report the exposure to the local HSE Coordinator.

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Working Near Health Hazards

Purpose

This document describes the policy for identifying health hazards in the workplace.

Policy

IF identified hazards are present in the work environment, **THEN** they may require certain monitoring obligations.
